Introduction

- In 1998, the Government introduced its White Paper on Transport, which emphasised the need to address the use of cars for the school journey. School Travel Plans are seen as a key component in addressing school journey issues.
- A School Travel Plan is a package of measures aimed to reduce the number of 'school runs' made. A series of different measures introduced by the school, through the Plan, all contribute to reducing the congestion outside the school. Pupils, staff and parents are educated about and encouraged to walk and cycle to and from school instead, thus helping to increase pupils' independence, safety and health and fitness.

Context

The School has researched and produced of a School Travel Plan.

It is a central part of the School mission statement that the children should be safe, healthy and happy. As our school began to grow in numbers of pupils and staff, it became clear that an overview of traffic, parking and safe transport was needed. This is a collaborative plan as parents, children and staff were all involved in researching and devising the plan. However, there is a footnote that this is a changing plan which is sensitive to, and changes with the needs of the school and the environment around the school.

Overall Aims of our School Travel Plan

The Travel Plan aims to make overall journeys to and from Caversham Preparatory School safer, healthier and more enjoyable by:

- Making journeys to and from school safer for everyone;
- Reduce traffic in front of the school by reducing the total number of cars used for the school journey;
- Make sure that our vehicle entrance and parking does not impact on our neighbours
- Increase awareness of active travel and educating all about road safety;
- Improving Active Travel facilities (bike and scooter storage, helmet storage, etc.);
- Promoting alternatives to car travel (cycling, walking and scooting), increasing the percentages of active travel;
- Adding to our Eco and Healthy Schools credentials by encouraging our children to exercise more and keep the environment cleaner;

Plan Background and Production

Fundamental to the Plan preparation was the establishment of a baseline of current travel to/from School by pupils and parents. Consequently, in October 2015, all parents were invited to answer a travel survey. 56 parents replied therefore 67% of children attending the site (at that time) were represented by the Survey results.

Detailed analysis of the Survey led to a clear understanding of current travel patterns, and the issues and perceptions that parents have about the environment around the School.

Major Changes that have recently impacted on the School

Since we began to gather data and the Initial Plan, two major changes have had a positive impact on what is now our most recent thinking and the Plan has been updated again.

These are:

- We have added 'The Lodge' to our School thus increasing our staff parking which in turn impacts on parking for parents 'drop offs'
- Chiltern College closed their Training Block and Kitchen/dining Building. This has greatly reduced the amount of traffic coming in through the shared access. This is due to:
 1. There are now no kitchen delivery vans;
 2. There are fewer cars as there are no tutor staff for the students;
 3. There are fewer resources deliveries as there are no students;
 4. Now only a small admin staff work opposite us and they start at a later time than us;
 5. There are no students cars parked overnight in the car park;

6. There are no personal deliveries for the students

Data on Current Travel To/From Caversham Preparatory School by Parents

17% of all pupils live within a road distance of 0.5 miles of the School. Of most of these pupils, 14% walk /scooter to school. 2% cycle to school. This leaves 83% of our pupils coming to school in cars.

Of the reasons why parents drive their children to/from School, the most significant was as part of an onward journey – mostly connected to work. 34% of car journeys were, however, for convenience, time-saving or were considered the safest option. It is this group that that we want to work on changing their attitudes and practices.

Travel Plan Objectives

The Plan sets Objectives:

- 1) To increase the modal split for active travel of pupils from 16% to 18% by 2018.
- 2) To achieve a similar 2% modal shift for staff travel from the car to more active means of travel, against a baseline to be identified below.
- 3) To engage with existing initiatives to set up at least two new mechanisms that positively encourage walking and cycling to Caversham Preparatory School.
- 4) To greater integrate the pursuit of more active travel for pupils into the curriculum and classroom.
- 5) To budget for, and include the Friends of Caversham Prep in suggesting and supporting specific on-site improvements to help achieve Travel Plan aims.
- 6) To promote active travel to and from our School, alongside the negative impacts of car travel, to current and future pupils, parents, staff and visitors.

Cycling Policy	All cyclists to school must have had cycle training before being allowed to cycle to school, or they must travel with a parent. Cycle helmets must be worn. Lights on cycle must be in good working order at all times.
School Attendance Policy	All children must allow sufficient time to travel by sustainable means to enable them to attend school on time for the start of lessons.
Transport Policy	Only buses with seatbelts are hired to transport children on school trips and matches. Only buses with seatbelts are hired to transport children on school trips and matches. - Many of our families and staff are local and walk and cycle to school. We are a Gold Healthy School and Green Eco School so our children are encouraged to walk or cycle to school. The last Friday of every month is 'Walk to School Friday'.
- Most staff are in school by 8am.
- Before Care runs from 8-8.40am. So before care children (around 10 children) are already at school before the rest of the drop offs occur.

- School starts at 8.50am.
- Peripatetic staff i.e. (music teachers, sports coaches) arrive during the day or after school and not every day consistently.
- School finishes at 3.20 for Reception, 3.25 for Years 1 and 2 and 3.30 for Years 3-6. The staggered finishing time allows for parents to pick their children up safely from the front door of the school.
- After School Clubs run from 3.30-4.30pm. Depending on the evening anything from 5 to 25 children will stay for clubs and/or aftercare
- After Care runs from 3.30-6pm (with some children joining at 4.30pm after they have done their club). After Care Parents begin to arrive after tea at 5pm and stagger until 6pm. More parents come in cars then because they are arriving to pick up after work.

Entrances into/ from School

Entrance

1. Shared entrance for staff cars and parents drop off.
2. Separate entrance at the front just for Pedestrians.
3. Cyclists dismount and walk through the pedestrian gate.
4. Chiltern College Admin Staff use the same entrance, but they are in situ before our cars start to arrive due to their earlier start office start.
5. Staff park in the Lodge, entering through their own, separate entrance in Derby Road.
6. No delivery vans arrive at the Derby Road entrance.
7. No parents park in the Derby Road car park.
8. Delivery vans enter through the main gate, stop and deliver at the main school building (16 Peppard Road) and exit through the one way system.
9. There are no kitchen delivery vehicles as Queen Anne's deliver to our dining room using a trolley.
10. Visiting mini-buses for school matches always arrive after school has finished and park in our main car park.

Exit

1. There is a one-way system in operation and a separate, school only exit allows vehicles a safe exit.
2. Pedestrians and cyclists use the pedestrian gate, the same way as they come in.

Parking

1. Staff have designated parking spaces in the main car park.
2. Staff park in the Lodge and enter the school through 'The Lodge' (1 Derby Road)
3. Parents park in the school car park
4. Parents also park across the road from the school (near the doctor's surgery) and walk their children across the road using the middle aisle.

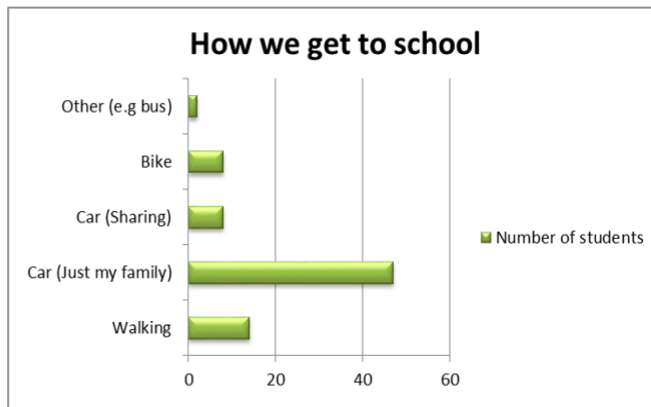
Go Green...
